

**REGULAR MEETING
OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS
WAS HELD THIS EVENING IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING**

Monday, August 28, 2017

Council President Anthony Sgobba called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. with the following members present: Marc Benitez, Maria Cordonnier, and William Liess. Also present were Mayor James Damiano, Township Attorney Joseph Wenzel, Township Engineer Dennis Lindsay, Township Administrator Charles Cuccia and Township Clerk Cynthia Kraus.

Absent: Councilmember Chris Vancheri.

Township Employees present: Police Chief Steven Post, Fire Chief Jack Sweezy, Recreation Director John Pace, DPW Superintendent Philip Simone, and Deputy Registrar Marlene Simone.

Following the Salute to the Flag, the Statement of Public Notice was read.

Mayor Damiano read a brief statement on behalf of the Council and himself, regarding the recent events in Texas as a result of Hurricane Harvey.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

On behalf of Councilmember Vancheri, Council President SGOBBA reported on the Passaic River Flood Advisory Board. The Advisory Board will convene with Nick Agnoli to discuss his presentation on the CRS and the new requirements from FEMA. Web pages for the Township website are being developed and the site is in the process of being finalized. Councilmembers were reminded to provide any links regarding their respective Committees. The Wildlife Committee hosted an educational seminar in partnership with the Clifton Board of Health on August 16, 2017. There were twenty-four attendees and discussion focused on the deer population. The next meeting will focus on phase II and a resident survey. The September 11th ceremony will be held on September 11th at 6 pm at Wilmore Park. The official flyer will be posted on the Township website and via e-blast next week. On Saturday, November 18, 2017 at 11:00 am a ceremony will be held to honor Staff Sergeant Michael Hollander who was killed serving our country ten years ago. The date was selected to accommodate Staff Sergeant Hollander's mother who will be in attendance. Roland Dey, Little Falls VFW Post 108, and Councilmember Vancheri are coordinating the ceremony.

Councilmember CORDONNIER reported the Transportation Committee has scheduled a meeting with NJ Transit on September 14, 2017 to address issues with the train station affecting safety and quality of life. A tentative date of September 14, 2017 has been set with the County Transportation Planning Committee to review the Transportation Committee's proposals regarding transportation, safety, and pedestrian safety in the Township. The Open Space Committee is in the process collaborating with the Township Planner to work on the Open Space master plan. Projects and grant requests are being prioritized. Superintendent Marinelli will present the school test scores, programs and progress made with the strategic plan at the September 18, 2017 Workshop. The Mayor and Council will host a meet and greet before the Workshop where refreshments will be served. Councilmember CORDONNIER directed residents to a website called GreatSchools.org where the school's test scores can be compared with other municipalities. Councilmember CORDONNIER addressed a comment made at the last meeting regarding how funds are spent in the schools. She reported that as of the first day of school, every student

at school #1 will have a Chromebook, at School #2 every student will have an iPad, and students at school # 3 will have a combination of iPads and Chromebooks.

Council President SGOBBA thanked Councilmember Cordonnier for spearheading the vigil regarding the events in Charlottesville, VA.

Councilmember BENITEZ reported the Prevention of Domestic Violence Committee is planning on launching a donation program as well as several activities including a vigil during the month of October, which is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Councilmember BENITEZ explained the Committee is collaborating on introducing a group called Partnership for Change, which educates children on domestic violence awareness through the school system.

Councilmember LIESS announced there will be a free pizza party on September 27, 2017 at 11:00 am at the Civic Center. At the event, several physicians will give a presentation on foot and ankle health. Councilmember LIESS concluded his report by declaring that the Recreation Center sponsored a successful summer camp, which included 228 children this year.

At this time, Council President read a list of intersections with obstructions due to overgrown landscaping. The list was prepared by Chief Post. Chief Post stated the list was comprised in response to complaints received, as well as observation from police patrols of all intersections. The list was forwarded to the Township. Mr. Cuccia reported the list was forwarded to the Code Enforcement Officer who visited every site. Mr. Cuccia noted compliance has been forthcoming and that the Township will continue to monitor. Council President SGOBBA requested an update at the next meeting.

MAYOR’S REPORT

Mayor Damiano announced an emergency generator was installed at the Recreation Center. There was a small fee incurred by the Township for the installation of the generator to make up the difference for the grant amount and the total amount of the project. However, due to a NJ OEM grant, the entire generator was able to be funded by a grant without cost to the Township. At this time, Mayor Damiano expressed his sympathy to those in Texas dealing with Hurricane Harvey.

Section 2. –COLLECTIVE BARGANNING AGREEMENTS

Salaries and compensation provisions negotiated through the current Collective Bargaining Agreements for the Teamsters Local 97 and the Little Falls PBA Local 346 and the Township of Little Falls are made apart of this ordinance. Employees covered by their respective Collective Bargaining Agreement shall be paid salary and compensation in accordance with those duly executed and approved agreements.

Section 3. –LONGEVITY

Longevity has been eliminated for all employees hired after January 1, 1997 are not eligible for longevity. All employees receiving longevity will no longer receive a longevity payment.

Section 4. OVERTIME and KEY EMPLOYEE VACATION

The following provisions of the within ordinance are subject to the provisions of any applicable Federal or State statute; and to the provisions of any applicable collective bargaining agreements.

- a. Key employees: The following employees, when employed full-time, are considered exempt key employees and designated management of their departments: Township Administrator, Township Clerk, Chief Municipal Finance Officer, Construction Code Official, Superintendent of Public Works, Tax Collector, Tax Assessor, Court Administrator and Police Chief. Key employees shall not receive overtime nor any regimented compensatory time off in lieu of overtime but shall be paid on an annual salary basis as provided from time to time in the Salary Ordinance.
- b. In lieu of overtime or compensatory time off they shall receive an additional vacation week annually. Overtime may be paid to key employees if an emergency is declared and the Key Employee obtains authorization from the Mayor to work during the emergency.
- c. Non-key employees: Overtime pay may be paid to or compensatory time off may be given to non-key employees; however, compensatory time must be used within the same year and may not be carried over. Compensatory time shall commence only after the employee has worked the prescribed work week. Authorized compensatory time shall be computed at one and one-half (1½) times the hourly rate.

The hourly rate for overtime shall be computed by dividing the annual rate of pay by the number of hours in the employee’s prescribed work week. In the case of a forty-hour work year, the employee shall be paid time and one-half after the full forty hours have been worked. For employees working a thirty-five hour week, compensation shall be at straight time for the first five hours of overtime worked; the time and one-half provisions shall take effect only after the full forty hours have been worked.

- d. Part-time employees: Part-time employees shall be paid overtime only when in a particular week they work a number of hours which under provisions of Federal or State Law requires the payment of overtime.

Section 5.

Such deductions as may be required by law shall be made from the salaries and compensation as hereinabove set forth.

Section 6.

The Township Treasurer is hereby authorized to sign all payroll checks.

Section 7. HOLIDAYS

Permanent full-time officers and employees and permanent part-time Township officers and employees who are regularly scheduled to work twenty (20) hours or more weekly for twelve (12) months a year, whether paid on an annual salary basis or hourly basis, are entitled to the following paid Holidays:

In addition to the holidays set forth in Section 14, all full-time employees and part-time full-year employees paid by annual salary shall be entitled to two (2) personal days off each year, except as may be provided by collective bargaining contract.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 10.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage by the Township Council, upon approval by the Mayor, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, FURTHER AMENDING THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS CODE CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE I, SECTION 7-16, "PARKING PROHIBITED CERTAIN HOURS FOR VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF FOUR TONS"

WHEREAS, due to concerns regarding the health and safety of motorists and pedestrians in the Township, the Municipal Council of the Township (the "Municipal Council") seeks to amend the provisions of the current code section; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the proposed amendment to the Township Code of General Ordinances (the "Code") concerning the parking of commercial vehicles on the Township roadways; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council has determined to amend Chapter 7, Article I, Section 7-16 of the Township Code to read as follows;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the Township of Little Falls, Passaic County, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The aforesaid recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.
2. The Municipal Council hereby amends Chapter 7, Article I, Section 7-16 of the Township Code to read as follows:

§7-16 Overnight Parking of Certain Vehicles Prohibited

A. It shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of a truck (including without limitation vans and pickup trucks), truck, tractor trailer, semi-trailer, commuter van, school buses, including Type I and Type II buses, omnibus vehicles (including taxis), motorized mobile homes (a vehicle with sleeping, kitchen, or bathroom facilities), used for commercial purposes, as defined by N.J. Motor Vehicle and Traffic Regulations 39:1-1, to park such vehicle on any street in the Township of Little Falls between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. prevailing time.

B. Such vehicles shall not be prohibited from actively engaging in legitimate trade, business, or commerce for which they were designed, such as delivering goods and services, but shall only prohibit passive parking. However, all such vehicles actively engaged as such shall cease from parking on the street by 9:00 p.m. prevailing time.

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 1300

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE RECONSTRUCTION OF WOODCLIFF AVENUE IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$675,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE STATE GRANTS, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls, in the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- Section 1. The Township of Little Falls, in the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey (the "Township"), is hereby authorized to reconstruct Woodcliff Avenue in, by and for the Township. Said improvement shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. It is hereby determined and stated that said road being improved is of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").
- Section 2. The sum of \$675,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvement described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the State grants appropriated by this ordinance. No down payment is required pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) because this ordinance involves a project to be funded by State grants. Said improvement shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefitted.
- Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said purpose is not a current expense of the Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of the Township pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$675,000, and (4) \$483,708 of said sum is to be provided by the State grants hereinafter appropriated, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$191,292, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$115,000, which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.
- Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that the sum of \$483,708 received or to be received as grants from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of such purpose.
- Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of the Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$191,292 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.
- Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of the Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$191,292 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.
- Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance, shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of the Township and attested by the Township Clerk or Deputy Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance, and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.
- Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

- Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of the Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$191,292 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Passaic, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose (other than the State grants hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purpose, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.
- Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.
- Section 12. The Township intends to issue bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 of this ordinance. If the Township incurs such costs prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes, the Township hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance.
- Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Township, and the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, the Township of Little Falls (“Township”) is a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey; and
WHEREAS, the Township’s Code of General Ordinances (“Code”) currently prohibits parking at all times on certain specified streets in the Township; and
WHEREAS, the municipal council (“Municipal Council”) of the Township has determined to amend Chapter 7, Subchapter 7-13 of the Code to prohibit parking on additional designated streets, or portions thereof; and
WHEREAS, the Municipal Council has also determined to amend Chapter 7, Subchapters 7-11 and 7-14 of the Code to eliminate the two (2) hour parking restrictions on certain designated streets; and
WHEREAS, the Municipal Council has determined to amend Subchapters 7-13, 7-11 and 7-14 of the Code to read as follows (additions are underlined and deletions are with strikes):

PUBLIC COMMENT – GENERAL MATTERS

It was moved by Councilmember Benitez, seconded by Councilmember Cordonnier, that the meeting be and it was opened to the public.

The Council President declared the motion passed.

Louis Fernandez, Harrison Street, requested clarification regarding the provision of the Police Department Reports to the public. Council President SGOBBA stated the Council will discuss as to whether more data can be provided to the public.

In reference to Bond Ordinance No. 1300, Mr Fernandez questioned why WoodCliff Avenue required reconstruction. Mr. Lindsay detailed the process by which projects are selected when applying for grants under the NJ DOT under the Municipal Local Aid Program. With respect to the Woodcliff Avenue project, Mr. Lindsay stated almost all for the reconstruction will be funded by grant money.

Mr. Fernandez stated PSE&G had been digging on Harrison Street and other streets, had stopped, and have not returned in approximately three weeks. In addition, a hole was made in his foundation. Mr. Fernandez requested follow-up as he has not been contacted by PSE&G as to when the project would be completed. Mr. Simone explained the crew that is to do the services is currently working in Totowa Borough. The Township was given an estimate of about a month as to when the crew would be in Little Falls. Mr. Simone will reach out to PSE&G to attempt to determine when PSE&G will return to Little Falls to install the services into the residents’ homes.

Raymond Kostroski, 170 Donato Drive, requested the corner of Lower Notch and Long Hill Road be given priority consideration to address concerns of obstruction of view. Mr. Kostrowski indicated that location will be included in the detour route when the Notch Road Bridge is closed. Council President SGOBBA indicated the property in concern will be added to the list to be addressed.

Barbara Moschetta, 29 Wilmore Road, requested clarification of Ordinance No. 1299. Council President SGOBBA stated the Ordinance pertains to those vehicles with commercial plates. Ms. Mocshetta requested the Council conduct further review with regard to large private vehicles. The Mayor provided clarification of the Ordinance. He added that the entire ordinance will be made available to the public. The public can then review it and determine if there are any issues to be addressed. Mayor Damiano then explained the process by which Ordinances are introduced, provided to the public for review and comment, modified if necessary, scheduled for a second hearing, and ultimately adopted.

She referenced comments made by Mr. Fernandez regarding Police reports, and noted her agreement that the community should be alerted of crime incidence. Mayor Damiano discussed his opinion on reporting crime with reference to the impact on property values as well as the individual implicated in the crime. He emphasized that any resident can obtain more information about a crime by contacting the Police Department. Ms. Moschetta stated the onus should not be placed on the individual resident to find out if a crime occurred. Mayor Damiano indicated that

while there are isolated incidents that may occur in the Township, the Police Department would use NIXLE or the Code Red systems to broadcast information to the public to increase awareness about a stream of crimes. Council President SGOBBA added that the Police Department logged in over 12,000 miles in patrols in a month.

Mr. Fernandez, added to his previous comments that personal information does not have to be included in the crime reports. Mayor Damiano reiterated his perspective that property values would suffer if every crime were reported. In the event there was a reason to be alarmed in an area, the Police Department would send out a NIXLE report.

In reference to property values, Mr. Fernandez stated the Township should be concerned about flooding on Harrison Street. Mayor Damiano reported the original Flood Board has been successful in shifting grant funds to purchase an excavator for the DPW to clean up the Peckman River. By using the Township's own manpower and not a third party, the project timeline can be under the control of the Township.

At this time, Council President SGOBBA stated that the Council takes the public comments very seriously. He elaborated that according to law, a meeting cannot occur after the Meeting. However, the Councilmembers may discuss issues that arose one on one with the Council President after the meeting. Professional staff and the Mayor may be consulted to come to conclusions that benefit everyone.

No one further having come forward to be heard, it was moved by Councilmember Cordonnier, seconded by Councilmember Liess, that the meeting be and it was closed to the public.
