REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS WAS HELD THIS EVENING IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Monday, December 19, 2016

Council President Louis Fontana called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: James Damiano (Mayor-Elect), Joseph Maceri, William Liess, Pamela Porter, Councilmember-Elect Maria Cordonnier, and Councilmember-Elect Anthony Sgobba. Also present were Mayor Darlene Conti, Township Attorney William Northgrave, Township Engineer Dennis Lindsay, Township Administrator Charles Cuccia, and Municipal Clerk Cynthia Kraus.

Absent: DPW Superintendent Philip Simone

Township Employees present: Police Chief Steven Post and Deputy Registrar Marlene Simone

Following the Salute to the Flag, the Statement of Public Notice was read.

STATEMENT OF PUBLIC NOTICE: Take notice that adequate notice of this meeting was provided in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-8 and N.J.S.A. 10:4-10 as follows: A notice of the meeting was prominently posted on the bulletin board at the Municipal Building, located at 225 Main Street, Little Falls, N.J. on January 8, 2016; a copy of the notice was faxed to the North Jersey Herald and News and The Record on the same date; additionally, a copy of the notice was filed in the office of the Township Clerk on said date.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Councilmember Liess, seconded by Councilmember Porter, that the Minutes of the Workshop meeting of November 14, 2016, and the Minutes of the Regular meeting of November 28, 2016 be and they were approved.

The Council President declared the motion passed.

REMARKS FROM CHAIR

Council President FONTANA remarked that as it was his last meeting, he wanted to acknowledge the good relationships he established. He commented on the hard work of the Township employees and the instrumental knowledge of the Township professionals in providing information on which decisions were based. He concluded by declaring his pride in working with them.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilmember DAMIANO wished everyone a happy, joyous, and healthy holiday season.

Councilmember LIESS wished everyone a Merry Christmas. He announced the Regional Flood Board convened on December 8, 2016. The construction of flood walls and the involvement of the Federal Government was addressed.

Councilmember PORTER stated she has been serving the Township for many years and was thankful for all of the friendships she established.

Councilmember MACERI wished everyone a Happy Holiday and reminded everyone to be safe in consideration of all the events during the holiday season.

At this time, Councilmember DAMIANO presented a plaque to Mayor Conti to acknowledge her years of service to the Township. He expressed gratitude for the work she has done in passing the torch.

At this time, Councilmember MACERI presented Councilmember Porter with a plaque to acknowledge her years of service to the Township. He emphasized her many years of dedication in various capacities as the epitome of a public servant. Councilmember MACERI also presented Council President FONTANA with a plaque honoring his service to the Township. He stated it was his pleasure to serve with Council President Fontana, as he has been a mentor to him.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Conti thanked everyone and stated she was happy to pass the torch to Councilmember DAMIANO (Mayor Elect). She announced she received notification today that a DOT Highway Safety Grant of \$41,720.90 has been awarded to the Township for the Safe Corridor program. These funds are typically utilized to purchase additional police vehicles.

At this time, the Mayor read the following Farewell Message:

My journey began in 2011 as I was sworn in as Councilwoman. January, 2012, I served as Council President before being elected to serve as Interim Mayor in February that same year. You, the residents of Little Falls had the confidence in me to elect me to a four year term as your first woman Mayor under this form of Government and it has been my honor and privilege to serve as your Mayor.

Early in my term, I was faced with Hurricane Sandy, 460 tax appeals, an uncompleted Justice Complex and very high legal expenses just to give you a sense of where we started. After Hurricane Sandy, we implemented many procedures and are now better prepared for any future emergencies. We took the initiative and appealed to the County for permission to perform a re-evaluation of assessed values in order to stabilize our taxes and reduce tax appeals. Our legal expenses which were high are now reduced and more in line with legal expenses commiserate for a small municipality. Another area of great savings was our ability to right size our operating departments. Placing well qualified employees in key positions has saved the Township costs and improved efficiency and effectiveness. In 2013, our Justice Complex was finally completed and we moved our Police and Court all under one roof.

Throughout my tenure, we were also able to begin the process of "branding" Little Falls. We changed zoning in the Business District in support of the Transit Village plan, a plan that everyone had been working towards for so many years, and yes we filed our application for a Transit Village Designation. If granted, Little Falls will be the first municipality in Passaic County to receive this designation.

We also completed and implemented our Master Plan re-examination recommendations and our Flood Mitigation program. Our CRS rating was also improved during my administration. We brought the Police Department to full staff and implemented an EMS program that has improved our response time to less than five minutes. We replaced the Fire Department's oldest engine and resolved the radio communications issues we were saddled with by prior administrations. We continue to make infrastructure improvements in order to maintain the good home values we enjoy here in Little Falls.

Even though I will not be here on a day-to-day basis, this good work must continue. There are future developments that I have been working on that deserve continued consideration. Development of the old Walgreens site regarding Senior Housing; the Paul O Abbe site as it relates to the Transit Village development, the Laundry site as a possible redevelopment area, and the Overlook building slotted for redevelopment. These are the things that will truly stabilize the tax base in Little Falls.

As this is my last official meeting, I leave my visions to Mayor-elect James Damiano. I have full confidence that he will consider these development opportunities and continue what has been started to make Little Falls great.

My sincere congratulations and best wishes to Mayor-elect James Damiano, Council-elect Tony Sgobba, and Council-elect Maria Cordonnier. To our employees and our volunteers...you are all very hard workers and I thank you from the bottom of my heart for your dedication to Little Falls...we are truly fortunate to have such wonderful men and women who will always put Little Falls first when the going gets tough.

In closing, let me say: I leave you with a better Little Falls than when I started this journey and I humbly thank you for your support, and candid advice. It has made me a better Mayor and Little Falls a better community. It has truly been an honor to serve you, the residents of Little Falls.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Mr. Northgrave had nothing to report.

PUBLIC COMMENT

It was moved by Councilmember Porter, seconded by Councilmember Maceri, that the meeting be and it was opened to the public.

The Council President declared the motion passed.

<u>Ted Klum,</u> 39 Crestmont Road, discussed his intention to pursue support of a resolution to resolve issues with the pedestrian gate at the end of Crestmont Road. In discussion with Mr. Cuccia, he was informed a resolution may be presented to the Council in January.

<u>Rick Kienzlen, Sr.,</u> 36 Crestmont Road, expressed his disappointment regarding the ultimate use of the current gate. He added that negative statements made about the behavior of Crestmont Road residents towards Great Notch Village residents parking on Crestmont Road were unsubstantiated.

<u>Jim Galione</u>, 33 Crestmont Road, indicated that the parking situation on Crestmond Road has been an obstacle to proper street cleaning.

Renea Shapiro, ABC, wished Council President Fontana and Councilmember Porter the best of luck. She commended Mayor Conti on being a true friend of the ABC, accomplishing much during her tenure. She wished Councilmember and Mayor-Elect Damiano much luck.

<u>Maria Cordonnier</u>, 648 Upper Mountain Road, reiterated her concerns regarding debt incurred by the Township in relation to the proposed Duva field improvements. She posited the idea to consider additional grants to alleviate the cost burden.

<u>Dorothy O'Haire</u>, Turnberry Road, extended her gratitude to Mayor Conti for her support and attendance at Regional Flood Board meetings. She was advised that the Township received permits for two of the three bridges.

Jill Kienzlen, 36 Crestmont Road, summoned the Council's support to remediate the gate issue on Crestmont Road.

<u>Mark Seiber</u>, 23 Haines Place, Little Falls Athletic Club, encouraged the Council to approve the bond ordinance for Duva field, stating any improvements to the field would benefit many residents that utilize the facility.

<u>John Herman</u>, 122 Ridge Avenue, made the Council aware of a potential safety issue on Main Street. Metal cellar doors on the north side of Main Street have deteriorated and pose a hazard to pedestrians.

<u>Cathleen Zehnacker</u>, 141 Browertown Road, reported on her experience at the Passaic County Freeholder's meeting and recent information she had gained.

<u>Rick Kienzlen, Sr.,</u> 36 Crestmont Road, added the names of residents from two additional addresses on Crestmont Road residents who could not attend tonight's meeting, but support ridding the pedestrian gate previously referenced.

No one further having coming forward to be heard, it was moved by Councilmember Damiano, seconded by Councilmember Porter, that the meeting be and it was closed to the public.

The Council President declared the motion passed.

Mr. Cuccia informed the Council Mr. Klum had sent a resolution he prepared for the Council's consideration. However, Mr. Cuccia had explained the process to Mr. Klum, by which a resolution is brought forth to a Workshop Meeting, where the Council may accept or modify the resolution. The next Workshop is slated for January 9, 2017. Additionally, Mr. Cuccia reported follow-up with Mr. Northgrave's office and that the original Planning Board version regarding the gate is being reviewed. Discussions to amend the parking ordinance on Crestmont Road have also been initiated.

Council President FONTANA thanked Ms. Shapiro for her comments. He also expressed agreement with Ms. Cordonnier's remarks to explore resourceful methods, such as grants, to reduce the cost burden for Duva field improvements. Mr. Cuccia inserted that some options may be to phase the work to be done and/or group grants together. He added that as long as improvements are not started, the Township can apply for grant funds. However, coordination with the Township Engineer must occur to comply with the timing of grants.

Council President FONTANA thanked Ms. O'Haire for her comments and confirmed that Mr. Seiber's remarks were adequately addressed.

Mr. Cuccia to send Code Enforcement to examine the safety issue raised by Mr. Herman.
