REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS WAS HELD THIS EVENING IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Monday, January 24, 2011

Council President Louis Fontana called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. with the following members present: Mercedes Gonzalez, Darlene Post, Joseph Sisco and John Vantuno. Also present were Mayor Michael DeFrancisci, Township Attorney Associate Jeffrey Trapanese, Township Engineer Dennis Lindsay, Municipal Clerk William Wilk and Township Administrator Matthew Kazmierczak.

Following the Salute to the Flag, the Statement of Public Notice was read.

REMARKS FROM CHAIR

Council President FONTANA commended the DPW on their work in the recent snow storms; he explained that more snow is expected and asked that everyone remain patient regarding the removal of the snow. He also asked residents to help out by clearing their sidewalks or digging out fire hydrants. He also informed that the schedule for the Passaic County Peckman Preserve design study will be on Thursday, 2/10/11 at 7:00 p.m. at the Civic Center

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilmember SISCO said they have a couple of items regarding OEM to be discussed later in the meeting.

Councilmember GONZALEZ explained that she met with the Little Falls ABC this past week; she was very impressed with all they do for the town and she commended them. She also met with the Grants Committee, who she commended for their work and time, which is very much appreciated.

Councilmember POST informed that she met with the Transportation Committee and the Redevelopment Committee. In attendance with two representatives from our County Transportation Planning Department, and they reviewed several goals for the Transit Village and how they would like to move forward. They would like to get together with the Transit DOT to discuss possibilities of the train station. She asked that Mr. Wilk send out letters to seek out grants that may be available to Little Falls. She also informed that she attended a seminar for newly elected officials on Saturday, which was very informative. She congratulated all of the members of Fire Company No. 4. Referring to the Morris Canal parking lot, she asked Mr. Trapanese to look into the existing ordinances on parking regulations. Mr. Trapanese said he would look into this and report back.

Councilmember VANTUNO explained that he has reached out to the Board of Education. He informed that they will be setting up quarterly meetings, and he will report back accordingly.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor DeFrancisci informed that he attended a dinner for Fire Company No. 4 on Saturday, which he described to be a nice event; he thanked the company for inviting him. Regarding the parking lot Councilmember Post had referred to, he said he spoke to Mr. Simone about this, and informed that they were out there clearing the snow this past weekend. He assured that they would look into this matter further. He informed that the Township's new Planner from the Birdsall Group will be appointed shortly; he looks forward to working with them. He also commended Mr. Kauker for his time and efforts serving as Township Planner.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Mr. Trapanese had no report, but informed that they were able to convince a particular corporation to dismiss three tax appeals, which would have resulted in substantial refunds to the taxpayers.

He explained that it would be held during the day, since all Township Officials would be working then and able to attend. He also informed that the Emergency Management Team of Little Falls will be hosting an open house to the citizens on 2/24/11 at 7:00 p.m. at the Civic Center. PSE&G as well as another company will be in attendance to discuss protection to those who live in a flood zone. Members from the CERT team will also be present.

<u>Arnold Korotkin</u>, Long Hill Road, was pleased to see how quickly the new council members' email addresses were posted on the website. He referred to a recent article in The Record regarding costs each municipality has incurred for snow removal; between the sister towns, Little Falls had the lowest rate. He also informed that there is a possibility of getting a 75% reimbursement from the Feds; Mayor DeFrancisci explained that this was already done.

Frank Zimmerman, Long Hill Road, thanked Chief Sweezy and the Fire Department for their quick response to his son's house recently; they did a great job.

Brian Reynolds, 7 Notch Road, explained that he didn't make it to last week's meeting, and questioned why a meeting was scheduled on a Federal holiday.

ORDINANCE NO. 1114 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 686 OF MARCH 15, 1993 ESTABLISHING FEES FOR FULFILLMENT BY TAX COLLECTOR OF REPEATED REQUESTS FOR CALCULATION OF LIEN REDEMPTIONS ON THE SAME PROPERTY WITHIN SAME CALENDAR YEAR

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls as follows:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 686 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- In accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:5-54 the Tax Collector shall provide to any party entitled t redeem a certificate pursuant to this section A. (N.J.S.A. 54:5-54) two calculations of the amount required for redemption within a calendar year at no cost. For each subsequent calculation requested from the Tax Collector there shall be a \$50.00 fee. A request for a redemption calculation shall be made in writing to the Tax Collector.
- B. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:5-54 the Tax Collector may charge a lienholder of a tax lien \$50.00 for the calculation of the amount due to redeem the tax lien as required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:5-97.1. Any request for a redemption calculation shall specify the date to be used for the calculation, which shall be the date of the notice. Neither the Tax Collector nor the municipality shall be liable for an incorrect calculation. The fee paid to the municipality shall not become part of the lien and shall not be passed on to any party entitled to redeem pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:5-54.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

Council President FONTANA said this is a law change and they are introducing this. Mr. Trapanese confirmed this and clarified further, noting that they are bringing the Township's ordinances up to date with the State Statutes.

<u>Arnold Korotkin</u>, Long Hill Road, asked for an explanation of the Blue Acres program and questioned whether there would be any action taken after the Executive Session this evening.

<u>Bill Organiscak</u>, Yolanda Drive, suggested that the agenda be posted on the website from now on. He also suggested the idea of solar panels in town, noting that it is something they should consider in order to reduce costs in town.

No one further having come forward to be heard, it was moved by Councilmember Sisco, seconded by Councilmember Gonzalez, that the meeting be and it was closed to the public.

Mr. Wilk said he would check to see if there were other holidays that the Township didn't observe. Councilmember SISCO agreed with Mr. Reynolds that they shouldn't been holding meetings on Federal holidays.

Mr. Kazmierczak said they could easily post the agenda on the website. He explained that most people who signed up for the email notification system did so for emergency notifications only. Mr. Wilk explained that the deadline to place items on the agenda is Thursday, but informed that it often changes before the meeting on Monday. Council President FONTANA suggested they post the agenda to the website on Thursday as a draft, subject to change.

Joanne Bergin, Township Grant Writer, explained that Blue Acres is part in parcel with the FEMA programs. It is run through the State Department of Environmental Protection, who also does the Green Acres program. The program deals with flooding and helps residents when their property has been severely damaged over a few years. It shouldn't be considered as a mitigation program on a scale. The Township needs to sign an agreement to agree to put out a bid for demolition. Mr. Lindsay will also be involved in this process.

Council President FONTANA referred to the tax appeal resolutions on the agenda and asked Mr. Trapanese about the total amount of money refunded to the tax payers. Mr. Trapanese explained that he doesn't have these figures. Mr. Wilk said this Tax Collector's report shows that there was \$167,797 in refunds in 2010.

Council President FONTANA informed that they have previously looked into solar panels and are continuing to do so. Mayor DeFrancisci explained that they are looking at a few different programs, noting that there was discussion about possible use of the parking lot for this.
