- RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING INCREASE IN DEFERRED SCHOOL TAXES Mayor Damiano 1. explained the nature of the resolution.
- RESOLUTION INTRODUCE 2022 MUNICIPAL BUDGET Mayor Damiano presented a PowerPoint presentation summarizing the highlights of the 2022 Municipal Budget, which including an estimated \$22 increase in the municipal portion of taxes on the average assessed home of \$310,000. The Capital Budget Plan for 2022 was also presented with a breakdown of capital projects planned for 2022, which if approved, would increase debt service by \$678,500.00. The Budget hearing and adoption will be on April 11, 2022.
- ORDINANCE NO. 1430 PARKING MODIFICATIONS ON HARRISON STREET Mayor Damiano 3. explained the update to the Ordinance.
- ORDINANCE NO. 1431 FEE ORDINANCE AMENDMENT FOR RECREATION DEPARTMENT -4. Mayor Damiano stated this item was previously discussed.
- ORDINANCE NO. 1432 EXCEED MUNICIPAL BUDGET COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE -5. Mayor Damiano explained this Ordinance is done annually with the introduction of the budget.
- 6. ORDINANCE NO. 1433 EXECUTION OF LEASE AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 35 STEVENS AVENUE - Mr. Wenzel discussed the relationship between Ordinance No. 1433 and the development of a lease between the Little Falls Historical Society and the Township. The Ordinance will be introduced at tonight's Meeting and the lease will be available for public review and comment prior to the second reading.
- 7. ORDINANCE NO. 1434 -CONFIRMING TOWNSHIP'S OWNERSHIP OF SISCO LANE Mayor Damiano summarized this Ordinance pertains to the updating of the Township's tax maps. Mr. Wenzel explained the lots referenced in Ordinances No. 1434 and No. 1435 were researched and have revealed no ownership has been claimed for these properties. This Ordinance declares these properties Township properties. After the second reading a quick claim deed would be filed and notice would be provided to the owners neighboring property owners.

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls in the County of Passaic finds its advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$146,357 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls, in the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Little Falls shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$512,250 and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of Little Falls be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of

WHEREAS, the Township of Little Falls ("Township") has in its possession a certain property located at Block 98, Lot 1 on the Tax Map of the Township of Little Falls, more commonly known as 35 Stevens Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Little Falls Township Historical Society, Inc. ("Society") has requested that the Township agree to enter into a Lease Agreement which would provide for the lease of the building and veteran's park area ("Premises") on the Property located at 35 Stevens Avenue by the Society from the Township ("Lease"); and

WHEREAS, Society intends to establish within the Premises certain offices, museum, exhibition space and for other related public

interest purposes including space for associated non-profit enterprises complimentary to Society's purposes; and **WHEREAS**, the Local Lands and Buildings Law authorizes a governing body to lease municipally-owned land to a non-profit corporation for a public purpose (<u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12-14(c)), for a maximum Lease term of 50 years with 25 year extension (<u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12-15) and to convey municipal property to a duly incorporated non-profit organization or association in compliance therewith (N.J.S.A. 40A:12-21); and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls has found it in the public interest to enter in the Lease as permitted by law;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Little Falls, as follows:

- A Lease between the Township, as Landlord, and the Society, as Tenant, of the Premises located at 35 Stevens Avenue, according to the terms set forth herein and in a form approved by the Township Attorney, is hereby approved, and the Mayor and the Township Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Lease on behalf of the Township. 1.
- Rent and other conditions shall be fully set forth in the Lease.
- The public purpose of the Lease is to promote and advance the goals of the Society which include the stimulation of interest in the history and architecture of the Township, the compilation, cataloging and dissemination of such information, the preservation of 3 documents, landmarks and artifacts relating to the aforesaid purposes of the Society and making them available for research and study, and cooperation with other organizations which have similar purposes, goals, and interest.
- 4. The term of the Lease shall be for twenty-five (25) years with certain milestones that must be met by the Society within twelve (12) months of the start of the Lease term to secure certain grant funding and twenty-four (24) months of the start of the Lease term to complete renovations to the Premises.
- 5. The Society shall annual submit a report by June 30 of each year during the Lease term to the Township Business Administrator which report shall set forth the uses of the Premises that were undertaken by the Society and other non-profit entities utilizing the Premises during the prior year, the activities of the Society and other non-profit entities utilizing the Premises undertaken in furtherance of the public purpose for which the new leasehold was granted, the approximate financial value or cost, if any, of such activities, and an affirmation of the continued tax-exempt status of the Society and other non-profit entities utilizing the Premises as a non-profit corporation pursuant to both State and Federal law.
- This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication in accordance with law.

- (10) days prior to the time fixed for further consideration for final passage. Pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> § 40:49-6, at least one week prior to the time fixed for final passage, a copy of the Ordinance, together with notice of the introduction, including time and place fixed for final passage shall be mailed to every person whose land may be affected by the 15 Ordinance.
- The Township Clerk, shall, within sixty (60) days after the Ordinance becomes effective, file a certified copy thereof, under the seal of the 16. Township of Little Falls, together with a copy of the proof of publication thereof, in the office of the Clerk of Passaic County, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. § 40:67-21.
- 17. The Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized to execute any and all instruments and to do all things necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.
- All Ordinances, resolutions and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistency. 18.
- If any section, paragraph, article, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid, such adjudication shall apply 19. only to the section paragraph article subdivision clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

- This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and approval in accordance with law. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply 21. only to that section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.
- 22. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

The Mayor continued to explain even with the resultant additional green space, the developer at the Singac redevelopment site was required to install water storage such that there will be less water runoff than before.
