WORKSHOP MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLE FALLS WAS HELD THIS EVENING IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Monday, May 9, 2022

Council President Sgobba called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Christine Hablitz, Albert Kahwaty, and Christopher Vancheri. Also present were Mayor James Damiano, Township Attorney Joseph Wenzel, Township Administrator Charles Cuccia, Municipal Clerk Cynthia Kraus, and Deputy Clerk Melissa DePiro.

Absent: Councilmember Tanya Seber.

Township Employees present: Deputy Police Chief Bryan Prall and Recreation Director John Pace.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG

STATEMENT OF PUBLIC NOTICE:

Take notice that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-8 and N.J.S.A. 10:4-10 as follows: A notice of the meeting was prominently posted on the bulletin board at the Municipal Building, located at 225 Main Street, Little Falls, N.J. on March 11, 2022. LYME DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH PROCLAMATION - At this time, Mayor Damiano read the Proclamation recognizing May 2022 as Lyme Disease Awareness Month in the Township of Little Falls.

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH PROCLAMATION – Mayor Damiano read the Proclamation recognizing the month of May 2022 as Mental Health Awareness Month in the Township of Little Falls.

PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING JALEESA AL-KASSEM OF MO & JAY'S PASTRY – Mayor Damiano read the Proclamation recognizing Jaleesa Al-Kassem and congratulated her as a finalist on Food Network's #1 Champion on the Spring Baking Championship.

At this time, Mayor Damiano provided an update on traffic issues in the Township. The Mayor stated he noticed a substantial downtick in cars particularly along Main Street at the intersections of Stevens Avenue and Union Avenue as a result of an update in traffic light timing, which has allowed additional traffic to flow east and west on Main Street and Union Avenue. The Mayor further noted the Township does not have the authority to change the timing of the traffic light at Route 23 and Main Street as it is a DOT intersection. A virtual conference was held with the DOT whereby the DOT outlined a series of steps that can be taken, including a visual impact study, a traffic study if warranted, and an update of the traffic light timing.

Mayor Damiano then announced Shoprite donated over \$22,000 to install a new scoreboard at the Sports and Recreation Complex. The smaller scoreboard will also be replaced through a donation of over \$12,000 by Schumacher Chevrolet.

<u>Luis Fernandez</u>- 54 Harrison Street, expressed his gratitude for actions taken with regard to his complaint at a prior Meeting. Mayor Damiano reiterated should residents have a concern, to reach out to the Mayor to have it addressed.

<u>Bill Leonard</u> -384 Main Street, requested information on affordable housing in the Township. Mayor Damiano explained that as soon as the mechanism is set up in which applicants can apply for these units, it will be made available through the LFNJ website. There will be 43 affordable units will be created within the development. The Mayor emphasized that they are affordable not subsidized housing, meaning the units are offered at a reduced rate

compared to similar market rate units. Councilmember KAHWATY requested clarification that the units are for rent not for sale.

Luis Fernandez - requested clarification that the development under discussion is the Singac redevelopment to which Mayor Damiano confirmed.

John Pace – Director of Recreation, announced 634 individuals signed up for spring sports, the Tri Town Fishing Tournament in Woodland Park is approaching, and summer camp starts July 5th.
