RECYCLABLE ITEMS

Appliances and Metal - Refrigerators, stoves, washers, air conditioners, fencing, and similar items can either be dropped off or picked up for a fee of \$5.00 per item (payment in advance required for pickups). Payments can be made at the Recycling Office (70 Sindle - DPW facility) or the Municipal Building (225 Main St). Alternatively, payments can be mailed to the Township of Little Falls, 225 Main St, Attn: Recycling Dept. Pickups will be scheduled within a couple of days once the fee is paid.

Car Batteries - They may be dropped off at the Recycling Center, and assistance for disposal can be obtained from the attendant.

Cardboard - Place it at the curb (not in the street) on your assigned collection day.

Clothes - Donation boxes for clothes are available at the Recycling Center. Avoid leaving items on the ground.

Commingled Containers - Place it at the curb (not in the street) on your assigned collection day.

Electronics - TVs, computers, monitors, telephones, VCRs, DVD players, stereos, etc., can be dropped off at the Recycling Center in the electronics box. Residents can also arrange a pickup by calling (973-256-6815), with a \$5.00 fee for TVs larger than 35 inches and/or console TVs.

Grass and Leaves - Only use paper biodegradable bags for collection (do not place them in the street). Collection days are Monday for Section I and Tuesday for Section II. Bags must be at the curb by 6 a.m., weigh no more than 40 lbs., and will be collected until snowfall. Alternatively, residents can drop off grass and leaves at the Recycling Center in the designated area. No plastic bags are allowed, and loose leaves should not be placed in the street.

Holiday Trees - Curbside pickup is available throughout January, weather and schedule permitting. Residents can also drop off trees at the Recycling Center in the designated area for branches.

Paper - Place it at the curb (not in the street) on your assigned collection day.

Paints, Chemicals, Propane Tanks, etc. - The Recycling Center cannot accept these items due to legal restrictions. Contact the Passaic County Office of Recycling at 973-881-4506 for disposal information.

Tires - Auto tires and small truck tires can be brought to the Recycling Center on Sindle Ave. Car tires incur a \$4 fee each, and truck tires cost \$15 each.

Tree Branches - Call 973-256-6815 to schedule a pickup. Branches must not exceed 10 feet in length, be stacked neatly with cut ends facing the same way, and those 3 feet or smaller must be bundled. Place branches by the curb, accessible but not in the street. Roots and tree stumps are not permitted.

Note: The Township is restricted from collecting household hazardous waste, including oil-based paints, paint thinners, gasoline, pesticides, herbicides, acids, etc. Any inquiries regarding appropriate disposal methods and locations should be directed to the Passaic County Office of Solid Waste Management at 973-881-4506. Please refrain from disposing of these items in the garbage or bringing them to our recycling center.

- Bundle wood and carpet in packages not exceeding 6 feet in length and 50 lbs., limited to 2 bundles per week.
- Up to 2 larger items, such as sofas, furniture, beds, etc., may be placed for pickup on the second collection of the week.
- Materials from contractors working on your property must be removed by the contractors themselves.
- Homeowners are responsible for the removal of any construction debris, as it will not be collected.
- The Township recycling center does not accept any type of garbage.

*We will only accept plastics marked with #1, #2, & #5. All other plastics should be placed in the garbage at this time.

*#3, #4, #6 & #7 NOT ACCEPTED WITH RECYCLING.

*Commingled materials to be placed in recycling barrels. No Plastic Bags.

*Plastic Bags can be recycled at various stores that accept these bags.

CONTAINERS SHOULD BE SET OUT NO EARLIER THAN DUSK ON THE DAY PRECEDING COLLECTION AND MUST BE POSITIONED BY 6 A.M. ON COLLECTION DAY.

- Each container should not exceed 60 lbs., and a maximum of 5 containers is permitted.
- Avoid placing containers on the street.
- Paint is not permitted in regular garbage, except for dried-out latex/water-based paint.
- Utilize sand or kitty litter to facilitate drying and leave the paint can top off to indicate its dry status.
