UPDATE - April 1, 2022

COVID-19 Updates will be provided monthly until further notice.

As of March 1, 2022, masks are now optional in all municipal buildings within the Township. (Please note that the Library, which is its own entity, may still require masks within their building).

In the month of March (5 weeks), there have been 33 new COVID-19 cases.

The total number of COVID-19 cases for the Township of Little Falls is 2,671.

The total number of COVID-19-related deaths in the Township of Little Falls is 18.

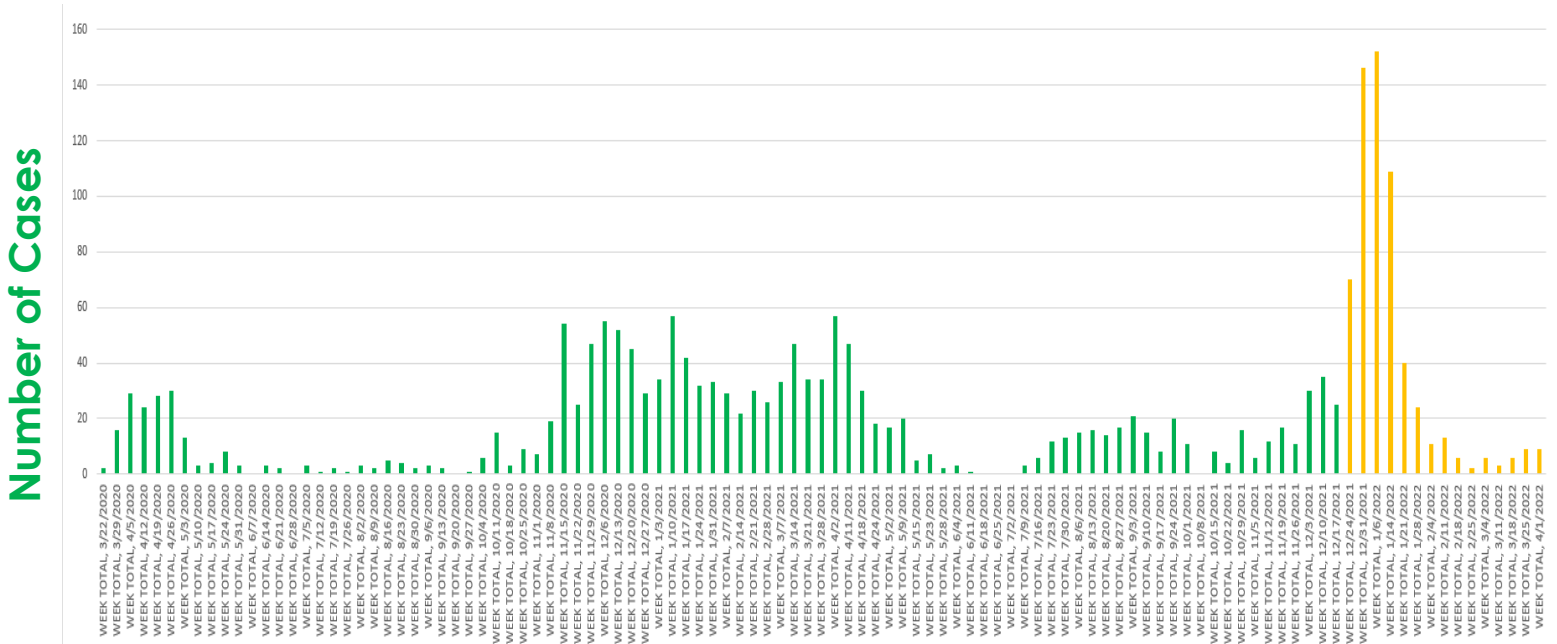
