Little Falls Monthly Report

July 1, 2023- July 31, 2023

During the month of July, the Infectious Disease team made sure to advertise upcoming events to Little Falls residents. Some events included free screenings at the City of Clifton Satellite Office and the Bivalent Booster clinic. The Bivalent booster is now open to those:

Who is eligible for the first Bivalent vaccine?

- Anyone 18 & over is eligible for the bivalent COVID-19 vaccine
- Must be at least 2 months since the previous dose (Primary Series or Booster)

Who is eligible for an ADDITIONAL Bivalent vaccine?

- Additional Bivalent vaccines are available for those 65 years and older at least 4 months after the initial dose of the bivalent COVID-19 vaccine.
- Those who are moderately to severely immunocompromised least 2 months following the initial dose of a bivalent COVID-19 vaccine

The team also made sure to provide COVID-19 tests to Little Falls residents. Test kits were delivered to both the Little Falls Recreation Center and Little Falls Town Hall. It is important that Little Falls has access to COVID-19 test kits throughout summer and even into the school year. Children and families are still gathering together and we want to make sure everyone is safe and COVID free!
