

Health Officer's Little Falls 3rd quarter report for period of: July 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022

- Communicated with Mayor and Business Administrator on a regular basis regarding trending and emerging public health issues.
- Health Officer edited and approved all press releases, flyers, and social media posts. All clinics and programs are offered to Little Falls residents at City Hall and at our Satellite office located in Botany Village on Parker Ave.
- Led the Covid-19 & Monkeypox informational session held in Little Falls council chambers on August 9th at 6pm-7:30pm
- Attended Passaic County Public Health Partnership meeting on behalf of Little Falls September 8 2022.
- Responds to various emails received from residents.
- Approved Health Educator to conduct tobacco age of sale and flavor inspections.

The Clifton Health Department submitted all of its required documentation for voluntary national public health accreditation to the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) on September 9, 2022. This documentation shows that the Health Department is ensuring the health and safety of its residents, while using innovative evidence-based practices. Accreditation is a vehicle to transparency and trust in public health, so communities can feel confident that their health departments are providing foundational capabilities and meeting national standards for performance and quality.

Accreditation is a status that provides public notification that an institution, program, or agency meets standards of quality set forth by an accrediting agency. The accreditation process reflects the fact that the health department is committed to self-study and external review by one's peers. Accreditation has been widely accepted by many fields within the US including the healthcare system, schools, and social service agencies such as police and fire departments. Likewise, public health agencies need to demonstrate their accountability to their community, and measure agency performance against nationally-established standards.

The Public Health Accreditation Board, or PHAB, is a nonprofit organization dedicated to advancing the quality and performance of state, local, tribal, and territorial public health departments by providing a national framework of standards. PHAB has a vision of improving the quality and performance of all health departments in the U.S. through voluntary accreditation. The PHAB voluntary accreditation program emphasizes the importance of and is grounded in quality improvement, and has catalyzed health department activity in this arena. The process of preparing for and achieving accreditation yields information about the agency that can be used to identify areas of improvement. Once accredited, health departments maintain this status for 5 years. The main component of the accreditation process is the documentation selection process, based on a set of standards and measures. These standards measure overall agency capacity as opposed to focusing on specific program areas such as preparedness or community health. The first 10 are based on the 10 essential services and the last two are based on agency administrative capacity and governance.

The Health Department looks forward to its upcoming site visit from PHAB and hopes to receive accreditation status in the coming months. Currently, there are only 6 accredited health departments in the state of New Jersey.


